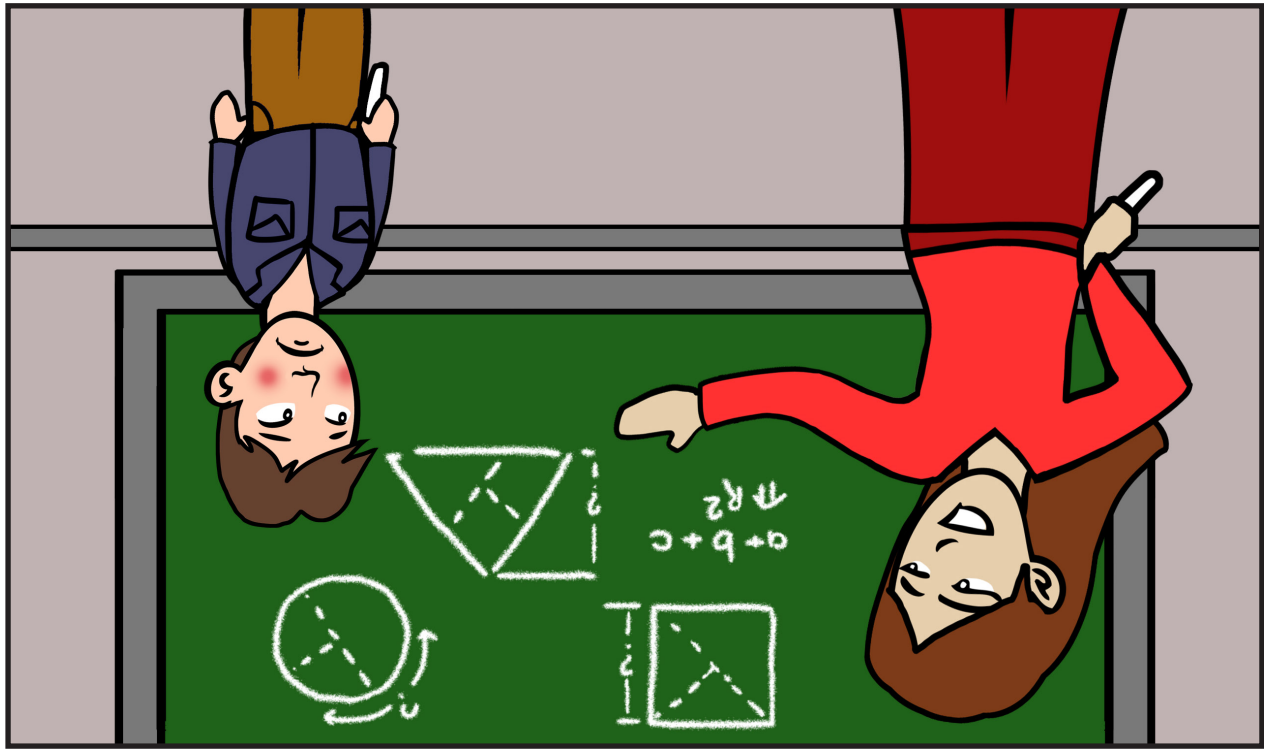

Lie less, Les!



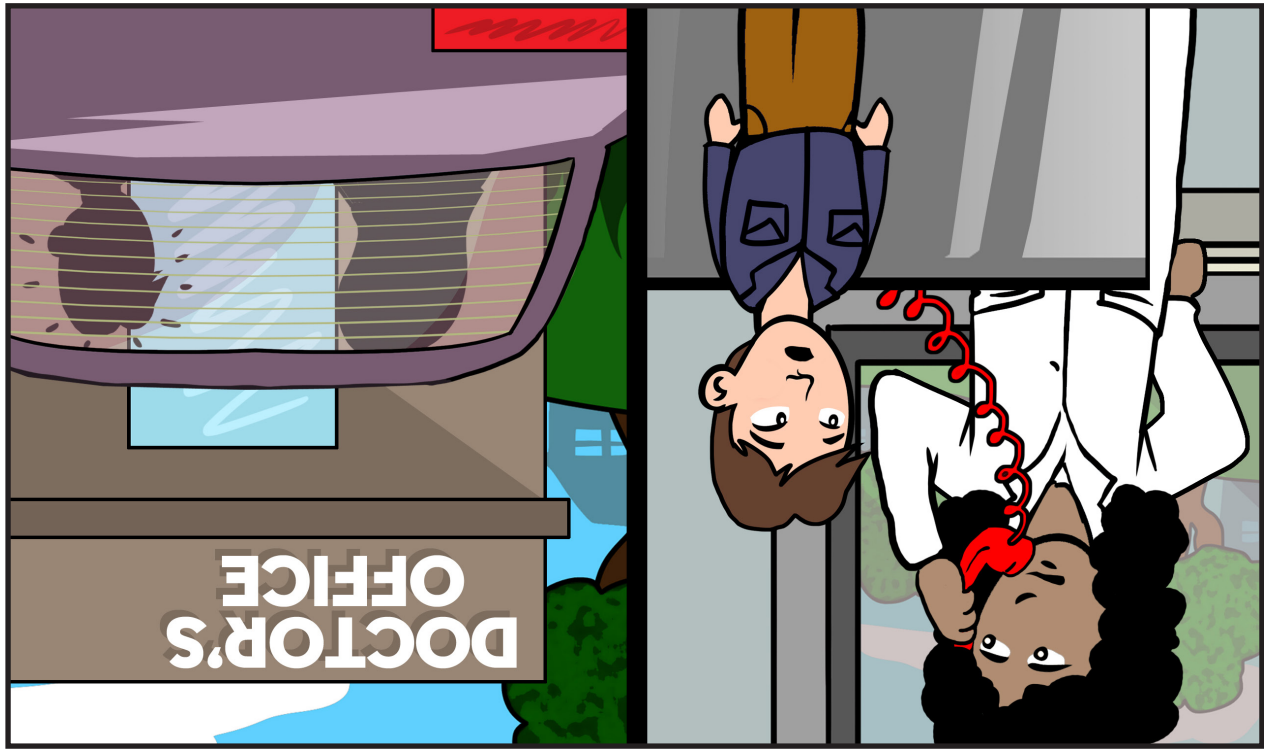

Les started to sweat up at the board, and his stomach hurt because he was so nervous. That gave Les an idea. Les lied to the teacher and said he felt sick.

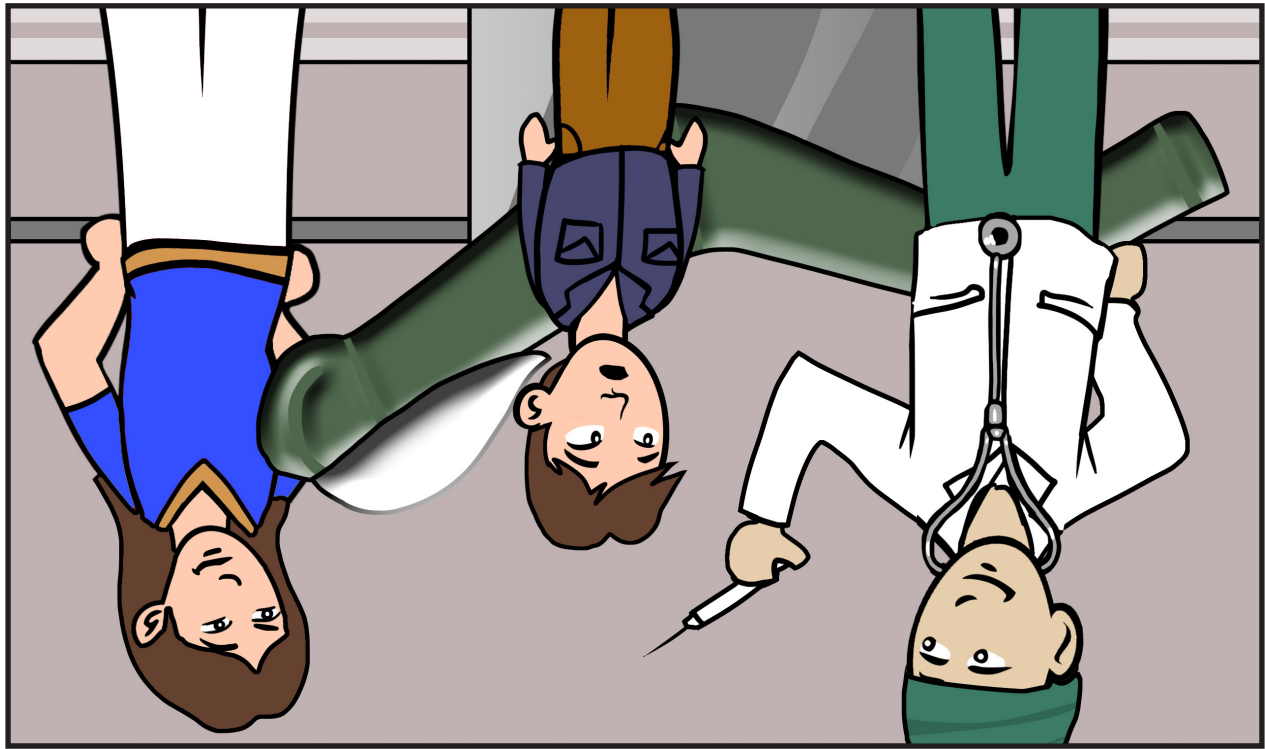
Lie less, Les!
